




Let's start here.

Indego, Philadelphia's bike share program, offers 24-hour, 30-day, and yearly pass options to ride one of the hundreds of bright blue bicycles, and white electric-assist bicycles stationed at more than 140 stations around the city. Indego embarked on the 2019-2020 season with the exciting challenge of introducing the electric bike to Philly. An innovation that, in true Philly style, has helped us deepen relationships with our communities, lower barriers to healthy transportation, and reach more riders than ever before!








Community Outreach

The City of Philadelphia launched Indego with a mission to make Indego an affordable, healthy, and convenient transportation option for all Philadelphians. The Better Bike Share Partnership (BBSP) is a City of Philadelphia-led collaboration funded by the JPB Foundation and the William Penn Foundation to build equitable bike share systems. Through this work Indego has developed affordable pricing options, educational programming, and community outreach initiatives focusing on underserved communities and communities of color.

Community Ambassador Program

Ambassador organizations share information about Indego in a variety of different ways, help to build partnerships with neighborhood organizations, and serve as the voice of Indego in their communities. This season the community ambassador team was able to organize over ten group rides across the city with residents and partners! These efforts continue to support building trust with the community, provide an understanding of how the service works, and support the Indego team to identify and address the unique needs of riders where they live and commute.



Indego Ambassador Resource Fair

This season was something truly special with the Ambassadors hosting the first ever Indego Ambassador Resource Fair, located at the Discovery Center in Strawberry Mansion. Indego Ambassadors past and present came together to create a space where attendees could connect and learn about the network of resources our ambassadors and other partners provide.

Educational Programming

Indego offers educational classes and community rides lead by the Bicycle Coalition of Greater Philadelphia to help individuals get the skills and knowledge they need to bike safely and confidently in urban environments.

Champion Program Graduates

This season, the BBSP team launched the *Champions Program*, a 3-part series of courses and group rides aimed at building skills for both beginners, and more experienced riders. We reached over 56 participants this season!

Digital Skills & Bicycle Thrills

The BBSP team collaborates with the City of Philadelphia's Office of Adult Education to provide a digital skills and bike safety training course for adults. Participants learn digital skills at their own pace while completing assignments related to Indego and bike sharing.

63% of participants completed the course
